Family and Friends in Christ,

Pastor and theologian Howard Thurman once wrote,

"It is ever a new thing, a glad surprise, the stirring of new life at the end of winter. One day there seems to be no sign of life and then almost overnight, swelling buds, delicate blooms, blades of grass, bugs, insects - an entire world of newness everywhere. It is the glad surprise at the end of winter... This is what Easter means. This is the resurrection! It is the announcement that life cannot ultimately be conquered by death, that there is no road that is at last swallowed up in an ultimate darkness, that there is strength added when the labors increase, that multiplied peace matches multiplied trials, that life is bottomed by the glad surprise."

Our church calendar is wise to have us endure forty days of Lent - a season where we face the reality of our mortality, repent of the violence we inflict, and attempt disciplines that help us to live simply, generously, and prayerfully - before we experience the joy of Easter. If we didn't face the hard and complicated things of life with Christ and our church community we would end up facing them alone. If we jumped from Christmas to Easter, from joy to joy, we wouldn't have the spiritual tools to face hardships with faith and hope.

But our church calendar is also wise to recognize that this is not the ultimate reality of life. There are forty days of Lent, yes, but there are fifty days of Easter. This year Easter lasts until May 19, when we celebrate the birth of the Church on Pentecost. Winter in Ohio is long, sometimes interminable, yet spring still comes. As the Psalmist wrote, "Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning (30:5)." Despite how final death may seem, it is but the beginning of new life. The trees are budding and birds are singing.

Easter is a season of attentiveness to what Howard Thurman calls the "glad surprise." The glad surprise is finding forgiveness when you expect a confrontation. The glad surprise is a call from a friend you haven't spoken with in a while. The glad surprise is stumbling upon a poem that is in tune with your spirit. The glad surprise is waking up and discovering you can now let an old grudge go. The glad surprise is found anywhere we realize that life is more beautiful and hopeful than we have any reason to expect. To put it biblically, Jesus said, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly (John 10:10b)." The glad surprise is found wherever there is life in abundance. We have done the hard work of facing the harsh realities of this life with honesty and courage. We do not leave these lessons behind. But, in these Great Fifty Days, we tune our heart to the Easter hope of the glad surprise; life has overcome death, grace has over come sin, and all the unjust powers of this world couldn't keep the tomb sealed. Thanks be to God!

The Worthington Resource Pantry, a non-profit community-based organization, opened in 2009. WRP offers a CHOICE food pantry, serving 8 zipcodes in northern Franklin and southern Delaware counties. Each eligible household can receive three days of food & personal items, twice each month. Their hours are Mondays, 10am-2pm; Wednesdays, 3-7pm; Thursdays, 3-5pm; and Saturdays 10am-12noon. In 2022, WRP provided over 846,000 meals and served 72,000 neighbors!

WRP also sponsors educational & health programs, and provides trained counselors to help families meet other basic needs. The resource center offers job and health care information and Ohio Benefit Bank referrals. See www.worthingtonresourcepantry.org

Want to learn more about what Worthington UMC does in our community? Looking to brush up on your understanding of Communion? Ready to take the next step toward membership at Worthington UMC? We now offer a new way to grow in your faith through our "Refresh. Explore. Commit." classes. This offering is for those looking to brush up on the fundamentals of our faith, who are curious about Christianity in general or Worthington UMC in particular, or who are exploring membership at WUMC.

Each month, we will offer the same four classes on rotation at **9am on Sundays in the Library.** Church members, guests, and potential new members are invited to attend.

Potential new members are asked to attend each of the four classes. You are welcome to go through the process at your own pace (meaning you don't have to attend all four classes in one month), and alternative arrangements can be made for those who are unable to make 9am on Sundays work.

The "Refresh. Explore. Connect." series will return on Sunday, April 14 at 9am in the Library. Preparation and registration are not needed.

The cycle will continue each Sunday in this same pattern.

Mission Trip recap

On February 25, Brad Arensberg, Frank Birinyi, Paul George, Russ Line, Eric Oldenburg, and Duane Snyder left for a six-day mission trip to Hinton Center in Hayesville, North Carolina. It was a ten-hour drive with stops for

meals and gas. After unpacking our gear and tools, we had dinner in the dining hall. On this trip we worked on a number of projects that helped out Hinton Center. On Monday, we worked on the lower floor of the chapel which is just outside of the dining room. The lower floor was a large room that was used by groups of kids for a variety of activities. Hinton Center will convert it into two apartments. We pulled up the carpet in the main room and removed the deck that ran half way around the building. All the materials were put in a dump truck to be hauled away. After that



work was completed, we took a trip up Bell Mountain for a panoramic view of Lake Chatuge and the surrounding area. The mountain was in Georgia, only a stones throw from the shore of the lake, which Hinton Center sits on. After the view, it was time for ice cream.



On Tuesday, we assembled 19 rocking chairs. These were heavy-duty chairs made out of thick plastic. We also did some cleaning of windows and siding on their new educational tool barn. A couple of men worked on building a fence out of pallets around a septic tank area to keep heavy-duty trucks from driving over it. On Wednesday, two men went to the house of a woman that had a hard time seeing. They installed grab bars, replaced some electric plugs, worked on getting the toilet working properly, and refastened some molding around the walls. The woman had

pulled the molding loose as she used it to steady herself as she walked through the house. The rest of the group finished up the pallet fence. They also built 4 heavy-duty tables approximately 80"x20". These tables were built with an inset to hold heavy tops from labs at schools. The inset would allow the tops to be even with the frame of the table. It took four of us to lift one top.

The Hinton Center has a firewood ministry. Last year they gave out more than 700 truckloads of firewood. Many people use firewood for heating and cooking. On Thursday morning, we split firewood with power splitters. We worked in three-man teams. The first person lined up the piece of wood; the second person operated the splitter; and the third person threw the split pieces onto the pile of split wood. Most of the firewood was 20" high and some was up to 30" in diameter.



After lunch we took a tour of the John C. Campbell folk school. We saw people in

classes making books, painting with a variety of tools similar to a putty knife, turning wood bowls, making baskets, weaving on a small loom, and working in the blacksmith shop. There were many other skills that were available. After that, it was time for ice cream.

Please consider joining us on our next Adult Mission Trip to The Nehemiah Mission of Cleveland (most likely August 25-30) or elsewhere. We usually do two 5-7 day trips each year. This is your chance to be the hands and feet of Jesus in carrying out his work. Join us for a time of fun and fellowship while we are carrying out God's work. I guarantee that you will have a good time and that the food will be great. Don't feel that you have to have a lot of skills in order to participate - we do the best we can with the skills that the members of the team have, and there is always something that everyone can do. More information will be available when we set the date and place for the next trip. For those who have trouble getting away, we usually plan a one-day mission trip in the Spring and Fall.
