Red Cross Blood Drive: Give Blood, Give Hope, Give Life. The American Red Cross sounded the alarm recently over a severe blood shortage facing the U.S. as the number of donors dropped to the lowest levels in two decades. The Red Cross said that the number of people donating blood in the U.S. dropped 40% over the last 20 years, which can majorly disrupt those needing emergency blood transfusions and other operations. The organization added there was a 7,000-unit shortfall in blood donations between Christmas Day and New Year's Day alone. WUMC is having their blood drive on Thursday, January 25, noon to 6pm. All donors will be automatically entered into a drawing for a trip for 2 to this year's NFL Super Bowl in Las Vegas, game tickets, hotel accommodations, and a \$1K gift card.
