Dear Worthington Church Family,

Our Lenten season began on the day of roses, chocolates, and Valentine cards! It, in fact, made some Valentine's Day traditions a bit awkward. Did we start our Lenten practices on the night we save for celebrating our beloved or could we start them the next day? It might not have been an easy choice for everyone.



The larger question is what do we hope to gain from our journey through Lent? The three main practices people focus on during Lent are prayer, fasting (abstaining from something to reduce distractions and focus more on God), and giving, or charity. Prayer during Lent focuses on our need for God's forgiveness. It is also about repenting or turning away from our sins and receiving God's mercy and love. It is about getting closer in our relationship with God. Fasting, or giving something up, is a very common practice during Lent. The idea is that giving up something that is a regular part of life, like eating dessert or using social media, can be a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice. The time of fasting/giving something up helps us focus on spending more time connecting with God. Giving money or doing something good for others is a way to respond to God's grace, generosity, and love for us. For example, some people spend time volunteering or donate money they would normally use to buy something, like their morning coffee.

Once you've chosen the practices you will observe, what is your Lenten goal? More than getting to Easter without your Pepsi and dreaming of the first cold one you can pop open, what is the lasting goal you hope to achieve? What result do you want? While the Lenten season is indeed preparation for Easter and the resurrection, it is important to ask if the practices we have chosen will help us arrive at our greater goal of transformation or renewal.

Perhaps it would be helpful to remember how Jesus spent his 40 days in the desert. There, Evil challenged Jesus to turn stones into bread, to bow to Satan for control, and to put God to the test. All these things were about control and power. Would Jesus make his own decisions and decide life his way? Or, would he surrender only to God's love and follow God every day, even to the cross? We all know that his experience in those 40 days would be the wrestling that kept him grounded throughout his ministry, giving him strength even on the cross.

Perhaps Jesus' goal was never to waver from his love of God and his comment to follow God always.

Bags of Blessings Outreach Program could use your help!

Thank you church family for continuing to support our Bags of Blessings outreach program! We continue each month to provide vital supplies to NNEMAP Food Pantry, YWCA Family Life Center, Family Mentor Foundation, Worthington Resource Pantry, Gates Fourth UMC Community Breakfast, and United Methodist Children's Services School Supplies.

On the first Sunday of the month, collection bags are hung on the bag tree racks with a list of needed items for that month's receiving organization. You are welcome to pick up a bag anytime during the month. Any items on the provided list are welcome, feel free to purchase what you can from the list. Purchasing all items on the list is not required. We ask that bags with your donations be returned to the church on the last Sunday of the month. Sorting of items happens on that last Sunday of the month in the Sanctuary following the 10am worship service. This involves emptying the bags and packing like items into boxes for transport to the receiving organization. Help is always needed. Feel free to come to the front of the church on bag Sundays and jump in on the fun! The donations are then transported to the organization by Dan McIntyre or Lesly Wade. And volunteers help the office staff print and stuff new lists into the bags and hang them back on the bag tree rack for the new month.

March Bags of Blessings to benefit the Family Mentor Foundation

Family Mentor Foundation began in 2013 with a mission to create services and partnerships that help fill in the areas lacking in a child's life. They seek to help meet the unmet needs of children in our community through a variety of programs and resources that will help them reach their full potential.

OMany children who qualify for free lunch or reduced-free lunch at their schools have little to eat at home and return to school after weekends, distracted by their hunger and unable to focus on learning.

Family Mentor Foundation's goal is to bridge the gap, to send these children home with a Buddy Box every Friday during the school year to alleviate their hunger. A Buddy Box is a box filled with kid-friendly, nutritious, nonperishable, individual-sized food items that are easy for children to eat or prepare on their own.

Each week they provide Buddy Boxes for 1,600 hungry children at schools in Worthington, Columbus, and South-Western City School Districts. Buddy Boxes are packed and filled by volunteers at Community and Corporate Gather & Give Events.
