#### Agape Meal

"The Agape meal (or Lovefeast) is an ancient Christian practice dating back to the first century AD, and a common part of early Methodist culture. It was a ceremonial meal of simple elements (often just bread and water) where congregants were able to enjoy fellowship while singing hymns, read and discuss scripture, and deepen their faith through testimonials. We are looking to create a group to study the history of the Agape meal, in order to create our own version of the ceremony to begin practicing at WUMC. This is a practice which traditionally was led by lay people, and we hope to continue in this tradition to create a shared experience which encourages our collective ownership over our own spirituality, as well as taking responsibility for the pastoral care of one another. We will meet November 6 & 13 at 6pm in the Dixon Lounge and November 20 at 6pm in the Library. #### Did you know...

The Summer Slump is real! Every year you hear us talk about the "summer slump" – a time when donations drop off during summer months. As you can see in the quarterly receipts above, our 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter receipts were significantly less than that of the first two quarters. Unfortunately, our expenses remain fairly steady throughout the summer, so most years we have to draw on our Operating Reserve or other funds to meet our financial obligations during those months. This year, to help offset the drop in 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter income, the Finance Committee and Leadership Board voted to allocate \$50,000 of this year's Smith Grant to the Operating Fund. (*Please refer to the article about the Smith Grant on page 6 of this publication.*) With this use of the Smith Grant, our 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter operating deficit was reduced to just (\$7,403).

#### The Smith Grant and Legacy Giving

For the past 10 years, Worthington UMC has been the recipient of a very generous gift from Wayne and Mildred Smith. Wayne and Mildred were members of our church and upon their passing left a 10-year undesignated legacy gift in the form of an annual grant administered by the Columbus Foundation. Between 2015 and 2024, Worthington UMC received over \$1.1 million from the Smith Grant!

Because the Smith Grant was undesignated (not given for a specific cause, mission, or purpose), church leadership has been able to direct the money as deemed fit at the time is was received. The Smith Grant has been used to support existing missions, allocate funds for growth and future missions, as well as support the our Operating and Building Funds during times when the needs exceeded the available resources.

Each year when the Smith Grant arrived, a group of church leaders met to decide how best to allocate to funds to meet the needs of the church as well as support areas of opportunity for growth. After tithing 10% of the gift to various missions outside the church, the following WUMC areas were supported in part or in whole by the Smith Grant:

Mission and Vision Development Leadership Development
Pastors Discretionary/Community Relief Funds Building Fund/Renovations

Audio Visual Upgrades Operating Fund

Technology Advancements Operating Fund Reserve

We are extremely grateful for Wayne and Mildred Smith for helping WUMC grow and thrive long after their passing with this generous gift. So much good work has come from the Smith Grant and will continue to for years ahead.

Worthington UMC has been the recipient of many legacy gifts.
